Clarkston affordable home repairs



Our **Clarkston Affordable Home Repair Program** helps qualified low income homeowners in Clarkston, WA who are in need of assistance with home repairs. By offering home improvements, the program will help preserve and ensure safe, decent, and affordable housing in our community.



brush with kindness



Our **Brush with Kindness** program mobilizes volunteers to provide exterior home maintenance assistance to low-income homeowners. It addresses a critical and often overlooked need: After years of deferred maintenance, homes fall into disrepair.



yard & garden loan shed



Our **Yard & Garden Loan Shed** makes it easier for home owners or renters to borrow the necessary equipment to take care and improve the appearance of their yards.
