Working in partnership with the City of Clarkston and Washington State Department of Commerce, L-C Valley Habitat for Humanity (LCV HFH) offers a Clarkston Affordable Home Repair (CAHR) Program.



Shirley Capps' family was concerned about her doing laundry downstairs, so repairs in her home are in progress to move the appliances upstairs. We will also install a ramp to facilitate access to and from her home, remodel her bathroom to be ADA compliant, and repaint the home.
